#### 2007 Silane Safety Seminar in Singapore

se of silane, a highly flammable gas, by the IC and LCD manufacturers in Asia has grown dramatically in the last few years. The **Asia Industrial Gases Association** has recognized the need to continue educating end-users in the handling of silane to avoid accidents in the industry.

AIGA is planning to organize its 2<sup>nd</sup> Silane Safety Seminar on 1-2 November 2007 in Singapore. A comprehensive programme focusing on safe handling of silane is being drawn up for the event.

The seminar will comprise formal presentations and workshops by leading authorities over 1½ days.

The seminar will target end-users, both from within the gas and the IC and LCD industries in South East Asia. An interesting programme is being developed that will motivate users in other countries to register as well.

The event will be held at the Conference hall of the new Singapore Management University in downtown Singapore. This facility is purpose built for lectures and is well suited for the planned conference.

he JIGA-AIGA joint task force formed under the International Harmonisation Council (IHC) to prepare a code of practice for arsine held its first meeting in Tokyo on 24-25 April, 2007.

Collaboration between the regional associations under the auspices of the IHC to develop new standards is seen as the way forward to achieve truly global standards for the industry. Such joint collaboration between regional associations has evolved since the establishment of the IHC in 1999.

The joint task force is scheduling four meetings to complete the projects on arsine as well as phosphine by mid-2008. The second meeting is scheduled on 18-19 July in Taiwan.
