AIGA Seminars

A IGA working jointly with the national associations in Malaysia, Taiwan and Singapore completed three technical and safety seminars according to plan this year.

AIGA is pleased that the last two seminars in Taiwan and Singapore were well attended with over 200 participants (industry as well as end-users) at each of them. (See page 3 for seminar highlights.)

Proposals for 2013

AIGA

The Work Plan for 2013 will see AIGA continuing to work with the National Associations to organise technical and safety seminars. Three seminars are already taking shape.

• The Gas Industries Association in India is finalising its plan for a seminar on 'Oxygen Safety'. This will be held at the end of January 2013 in Delhi. The programme outline is shown on page 4.

The seminar is targeted towards an audience that will include safety managers from the industry and end-users as well as invited guests from the regulatory authorities. • In Taiwan, the government bureau Council of Labour Affairs has indicated their support to the Taiwan High Pressure Gas Industrial Association for the next safety seminar in September 2013.

One theme being considered for the next year's meeting is 'Process Safety'. This was a theme for the EIGA Symposium 2011 and there is synergy in tapping into resources that are available from associates in other regions.

• In Korea, the recent tragic incident with hydrogen fluoride in Gumi in September 2012 has galvanised attention in the area of safety for specialty and toxic gases that are used in the electronic industry.

The Korea Industrial and Specialty Gases Association (KISGA) Secretary General, Mr. Byoung-Hoo Kim said KISGA is looking to organise a safety seminar on specialty and toxic gases in the fourth quarter of 2013.

This line-up of seminars in 2013 is not final as AIGA will be communicating with the other National Associations on their plans in the months ahead.


A new member, Frank Yang (Praxair), has also joined the team. Frank is based in Taiwan.

International Harmonisation

T he 31st International Harmonisation Council (IHC) was held in Frankfurt in July.

High on the agenda at the meeting was a review of new initiatives to strengthen the communication and work processes among the stakeholders in the IHC.

The Global Committee (GC), which has oversight of International Harmonisation, has agreed that the IHC would invite GC member companies to send company representatives to the IHC Meetings. They can provide a direct understanding on their companies' resource commitment to the harmonisation effort, so that the latter can respond quickly to the needs of the projects.

At the regional association level, Working Groups will increase cross-association communications through increased liaisons among work groups. This includes the sharing of work group members liaison contacts and participation in one another's meetings via teleconferences or face to face. The Medical Gases Work Groups have already started the liaison for sharing of information a couple of years back.

The new work areas identified for establishing interassociation liaison are in Specialty Gases, Food Gases and Acetylene. The Specialty Gases Work Groups are to kick off the inter-association communication this year.

Recognition of the work carried out by Joint Working Groups members was also given attention. For a start, the GC will recognise their contributions in the IOMA newsletter Broadcaster when their projects are completed.

The next IHC Meeting is scheduled in Kyoto from 5-7 March 2013 and will be hosted by the Japan Industrial and Medical Gases Association.


Taiwan - AIGA Technical Committee in Taipei
